Q-TIP PAINTING

I love painting with my kids, but there are some challenges.

CHALLENGE 1: ONE BRUSH

The painting set only comes with one brush...I have two kids. I usually can scrounge around for an old one, or steal one from my nice art set, but that doesn't always work out.

CHALLENGE 2: YOUNG KID STUGGLES

Small kids have small hands. This is a great alternative to a brush as they can have more control.

CHALLENGE 3: COLOR MIXING

The paint set doesn't last long. The colors get mix and there is nothing fun about a brown rainbow. Plus if an accidental mix happens, just use a clean swap to wipe it down.

CHALLENGE 4: ORDINARY ACTIVITY

Now, I never get bored painting. My children rather enjoy it, but why not shake it up a bit. So I came up with this new activity. Although, it's apparently not that new, when I searched it online there is tons of stuff out there... But, I suppose that's validation that it is a good idea!

SUPPLIES

COTTON SWABS

I used safety swabs here. They have a fat end for quick painting. Regular or precision swabs are great for more fine details.

PAINT

I used watercolors, but any paint will do!

WATER

I have two, because I have two kids. The 5-year old isn't a fan of sharing water with the 2-year old.

KEEPING IT CLEAN!

Not shown here.... I the girls usually wear an apron, and I keep paper towels and newspaper standing by to avoid further messes.
